Inclusive language is language that does not exclude or stereotype based on individual characteristics.

Champion your local LGBTQ+ community

Create opportunities for others to share their pronouns

Always use someone's preferred pronouns, and if you make a mistake, apologize and move on. It's okay!

Listen and ask with empathy

LGBTQ+ TERMS

- LGBTQ/LGBTQ+/LGBTQIA: Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Queer (or questioning), Intersex, Asexual (or allies). The plus is inclusive of folks who don't necessarily identify with any of these labels.
- Lesbian: A woman attracted to another woman.
- Gay: A person attracted to the same sex. Often used to describe a gay male and used as an identifier for anyone who is not hetereosexual.
- Bisexual / Bi: Being attracted to two genders.
- Transgender / Trans: a person who doesn't identify with the gender identity they were assigned at birth.
- Queer: An umbrella term describing anyone who identifies as something other than straight.
 Encompassing of LGBTQ community.
- Questioning: An individual who is exploring their sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Non-binary (Gender nonconforming): Someone who doesn't identify with any gender. Most use "they/them" pronouns.
